## Christ Is Risen!

One practice of commemorating Easter is the joyous greeting of "Christ is risen" and a response of "He is risen indeed!" It reminds us that Jesus is alive and in our midst and he welcomes us in a new life with him. The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; He has risen, just as He said! Come, see the place where He lay. Then go quickly and tell His disciples, 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see Him.'"

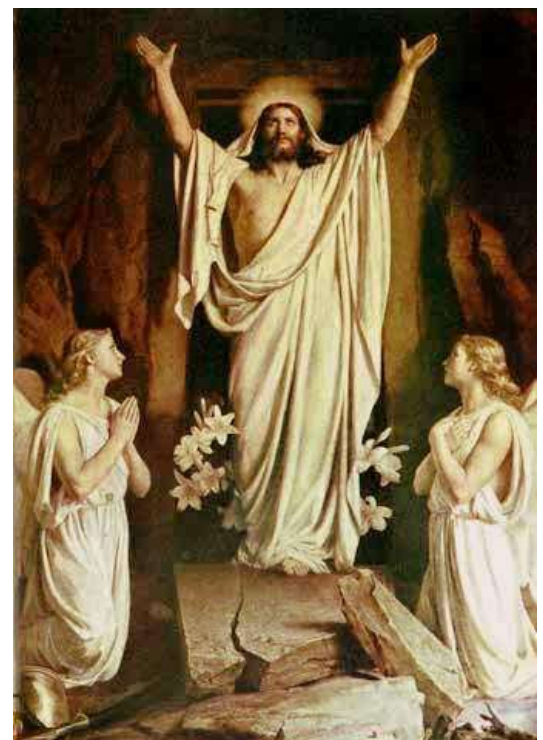
Easter Sunday, then, is the greatest of all Sundays, and Easter Time is the most important of all liturgical times. Easter is the celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian: Alleluia!

All faith flows from faith in the resurrection: "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith." (1 Cor 15:14) The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and lit for all liturgical celebrations.

Jesus links faith in the resurrection to his own person: "I am the Resurrection and the life." It is Jesus himself who on the last day will raise

up those who have believed in him, who have eaten his body and drunk his blood. In this present life He gives us a sign and pledge of this by restoring some of the dead to life, announcing thereby his own Resurrection, though it was to be of another order. He speaks of this unique event as the "sign of Jonah," the sign of the temple: he announces that he will be put to death but rise thereafter on the third day. To be a witness to Christ is to be a "witness to his Resurrection," to "[have eaten and drunk] with him after He rose from the dead."

Encounters with the risen Christ characterize the Christian hope of resurrection. We shall rise like Christ, with him, and through him. Christ will raise us up "on the last day!"

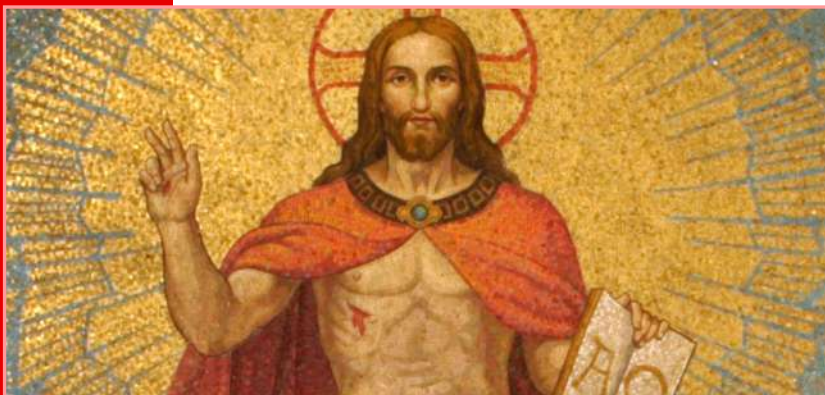

Christ is Risen?

From the Scripture quotes above, it would seem that Christ had not risen; but HE HAS! He told His Apostles and us that the End Times started when He ascended into Heaven. Generation to generation since the Ascension, people have been calling “evil good, and good evil.” However, it seems that in our current generation what is mentioned by Saint Paul to Timothy has become more prominent and more profound. It appears that in all levels of society, the family, the government and even in the Church, what has been evil is now called good and what has been good is now called evil. This may seem a hopeless situation. We are overcome with fear and we lose heart that we are not able to live our faith. We are afraid that we will lose something. Whether it is our pursuit of happiness, freedom, or even life itself. But Jesus has shown us that through His suffering, death and resurrection [the Paschal Mystery], He has shown us the power that comes from faith in Him. Jesus tells us to not be afraid. We are to trust Him, even if someone takes our life from us. As Jesus mentions in *Matthew 10:28*, “*And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna.*” So I am not afraid of what is to come. I believe that what is happening is to make us stronger in our faith. It seems that evil is winning, but it has already been defeated. Even though God has allowed through His Permissive Will that evil should have access to our world, it is only for a limited time because of Christ’s Resurrection. This is the time when we who have made the deliberate choice to follow God, who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, to stand up and proclaim our faith in Him. We are being called to witness to a world that is calling “evil good, and good evil.” Like Jesus on Good Friday, we will be mocked, spit at, persecuted for our faith in Jesus our Savior. We will have to die to self and our will and live God’s Will, even if living God’s Will will lead to a physical death. For if we persevere in God’s Will we will gain Eternal Life. Venerable Fulton J. Sheen said that we must go through a Good Friday before we enter an Easter Sunday.



This reflection may seem a bit peculiar or bizarre or confusing, especially for Easter, but it is exactly why Jesus suffered and died for us, because He conquered evil. Evil is Evil and Good is Good. Darkness is Darkness and Light is Light. Bitter is Bitter and Sweet is Sweet. Satan is Evil, Darkness, and Bitter. Christ is Good, Light, and Sweet. Decide who we want to follow. I know who I want to follow, even if I stumble and fall along the way for Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

## Spend Some Time With Your Guardian Angel Today

Padre Pio, had a very special relationship with his guardian angel throughout his life. We pray to our guardian angels "Angel of God, my Guardian dear, to whom the heavenly God's love entrusts me here; enlighten me, guard me, guide me now and forever." Padre Pio absolutely had this prayer at heart every moment of every day. He said "How great will be the consolation, when, at the hour of death, your soul will see your angel, who is so good, who has accompanied you throughout your life, who was so ample in his maternal care! Oh, that this sweet thought may make you, may render you continually more fond of the Cross of Jesus! This is namely what your good angel desires! May the desire to see this inseparable companion of your entire life enkindle in you that charity which moves you to desire soon to leave the body."

He relied on his guardian angel to help him through many tense times. He was close to his guardian angel, as we all should be, and he referred to his angel as his "Angelino," not a name, but a term of endearment, his "little angel." Padre Alessio was Padre Pio's secretary. He was to sort the huge number of letters pouring into the friary. He once asked Padre Pio about a certain request in a letter. Padre Pio expressed annoyance over these questions. "Come on, my son, leave me alone," he said, "Can't you see that I am very busy?" It seemed to Padre Alessio that Padre Pio simply sat in his chair, fingering his rosary. In fact, Padre Pio was communicating with a long procession of guardian angels. Seeing his perplexity, Padre Pio explained to him, "Didn't you see all those guardian angels going backwards and forwards from my spiritual children bringing messages from them?" The communication went on through the night; Padre Alessio would hear Padre Pio say to an unseen visitor, "Tell her I will pray for her," or "Tell him that he will be present in my Mass." Though invisible to Padre Alessio, Padre Pio could see the angels plainly. Persons



who sent their guardian angels were astonished at how quickly their troubles ceased.

Besides helping others, Padre Pio's guardian angel also assisted him with various matters. In a letter to his spiritual director, Padre Agostino, Padre Pio explained one of these services, "The heavenly beings continue to visit me and give me a foretaste of the rapture [or joys] of the blessed. And while the mission of our guardian angels is a great one, my own angel's mission is certainly greater, since he has the additional task of teaching me other languages."


We should thank our angels for all the help, love, and grace they give to us each and every day. Truly they are a grace from God! Those who lean on the mercy of God can be sure that our Savior sends His angels to surround and protect them.

When St. Faustina was dangerously ill, a radiant seraph brought her Holy Communion for 13 days (see *Diary of St. Faustina*, 1676). She also recorded how her guardian angel defended her from an assault by evil spirits (see 419) and accompanied her on a visionary journey to purgatory and to hell (see 20 & 741). In general, St. Faustina was constantly comforted by the thought – and sometimes given supernatural assurance – that we are not alone in our struggles for faith and love, but are surrounded by a "great crowd of witnesses" (Heb 12:1). She stated

"I thanked God for His goodness, that He gives us angels for companions. Oh, how little people reflect on the fact that they always have beside them such a guest, and a witness to everything! One day, when I was at adoration, and my spirit seemed to be dying for Him, and I could no longer hold back my tears, I saw a spirit of great beauty who spoke these words to me: "Don't cry – says the Lord." After a moment I asked, "Who are you?" He answered me, "I am one of the seven spirits who stand before the throne of God day and night and give Him ceaseless praise." Yet this spirit did not soothe my yearning, but roused me to even greater longing for God. This spirit is very beautiful, and his beauty comes from close union with God. This spirit does not leave me for a single moment, but accompanies me everywhere (see 471).

Never forget to thank your guardian angel.

## Divine Mercy

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And, He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

**A** - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

**B** - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

**C** - Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that all the graces of His mercy can only be received by our trust. The more we open the door of our hearts and lives to Him with trust, the more we can receive.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread. The message and devotional practices proposed in the Diary of Saint Faustina are completely in accordance with the teachings of the Church and are firmly rooted in the Gospel message of our Merciful Savior. Properly understood and implemented, they will help us grow as genuine followers of Christ.

Spend time to learn more about the mercy of God, learn to trust in Jesus, and live your life as merciful

to others, as Christ is merciful to you. Though the Divine Mercy message is not new to the teachings of the Church, Sr. Faustina's Diary sparked a great movement, and a strong and significant focus on the mercy of Christ. Saint John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina in 2000 making her the "first saint of the new millennium." Speaking of Sr. Faustina and the importance of the message contained in her Diary, the Pope called her "the great apostle of Divine Mercy in our time."



In His revelations to St. Faustina, Our Lord asked for a special prayer and meditation on His Passion each afternoon at the three o'clock hour, the hour that recalls His death on the cross. At three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy. In this hour, I

will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion (Diary, 1320)

### LET US PRAY

Saint Faustina, You told us that your mission would continue after your death and that you would not forget us. Our Lord also granted you a great privilege, telling you to "distribute graces as you will, to who you will, and when you will." Relying on this, we ask your intercession for the graces we need, especially for the intentions just mentioned. Help us, above all, to trust in Jesus as you did and thus to glorify His mercy every moment of our lives. Amen.

## Jake's Corner

For April, I am writing about Saint Gianna Beretta Molla. She was born in Magenta, Italy, on October 4, 1922, and from an early age, Gianna was very active in her faith and she strived to live a holy life. In 1942, Gianna began her medical studies in Milan and it was noted that she was a dedicated student. Furthermore, Gianna was an active member of the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. In 1950, after graduating medical school, she opened up her own medical practice in Mesero near her hometown. Additionally, in 1952, she began to specialize in pediatrics and was drawn to the care of mothers and children.

In 1955, Gianna married Pietro Molla and they later had four children. During her fourth pregnancy, Gianna started to experience severe pain, and her doctors discovered that there were severe life-threatening complications with the pregnancy. Her doctors gave her three choices, to have an abortion, which would kill her baby; to have a complete hysterectomy; or to have only the



fibroma removed which meant the life of her baby could be saved. She chose to save the life of her baby and to have only the fibroma removed. Gianna earnestly pleaded with the doctors to have them save the baby's life over her own. On April 21, 1962, she successfully gave birth to her daughter, Gianna Emanuela Molla. Furthermore, the doctors tried to save the life of Saint Gianna too, but on April 28, 1962, she died of septic peritonitis. Gianna Beretta Molla was Beatified on April 24, 1994, and Canonized a Saint on May 16, 2004. Her husband, Pietro, and their children, including Gianna Emanuela, attended the Canonization. It was the first time a husband witnessed his wife's Canonization.

I think that Saint Gianna Beretta Molla is a very important Saint for our times. We are called to be like Saint Gianna and defend the sanctity of all life, from the moment of conception until death. Additionally, through her tireless dedication to the care of others as a doctor, Saint Gianna inspires us to give more of ourselves for the service of our neighbors.
